## **Application and Eligibility Requirements**

Applicants must complete an <u>organizational capacity self assessment</u> as part of their application. We recommend you complete this with your team, which can take up to 2 hours. You may want to <u>download the assessment first</u>, complete it, and come back to complete this application.

This opportunity is available to staff of nonprofit 501 (c)3 organizations, fiscally sponsored projects under a 501 (c)3, and mission-driven food and farm businesses.

Mentorship will be prioritized for applicants who identify as Black, Indigenous. and/or people of color, and those who work with historically disinvested or excluded communities.

Applicants must commit to working with their mentor for a 4 month period and submit a brief follow-up survey.
